

Common Sense's Guide to Low-Cost Internet

High-speed internet at home can make a big difference. Fast internet can make it easier to do schoolwork, apply for jobs, and use government services. But what if you can't afford the internet? There are now several affordable options for high-speed internet. It can be confusing to locate the best option. This guide can help, but check the details carefully before you sign up. Common Sense can't guarantee these offers.

To get started, visit EveryoneOn.org, a nonprofit organization that helps locate low-cost internet service, computers, and basic computer training in your neighborhood. Type in your ZIP code to see what's available in your area. You can also text "Connect" to 21-545 (carrier charges may apply) for more details.



Access from AT&T: AT&T offers low-cost internet access to households participating in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) through its Access from AT&T program.

BENEFITS:

- No commitment, no deposit, no installation fee, and no charge for an in-home Wi-Fi gateway.
- Service availability and speed may vary by address. AT&T will assign you the fastest of the speed tiers available where you live:
 - 10 megabits per second, for \$10 per month
 - 5 megabits per second, for \$10 per month
 - 3 megabits per second, for \$5 per month

TO QUALIFY:

- At least one resident must participate in the U.S. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or, for California residents ONLY, receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits.
- You must live at an address in AT&T's **21-state** service area at which AT&T offers **wireline home internet service**.
- You may not have outstanding debt to AT&T for **fixed internet service** within the last six months or outstanding debt incurred under this program.

Comcast Internet Essentials: Comcast provides a low-cost broadband option. They also have new programs for seniors.

BENEFITS:

- \$9.95/month + tax, with no credit check, a no-term contract, no installation or monthly equipment-rental fees, 10 Mbps, and in-home Wi-Fi included.
- Internet Essentials provides low-cost internet service; the option to purchase an internet-ready computer for less than \$150; and access to free digital literacy training available in print, online, and in person.

TO QUALIFY YOU MUST:

- Live in an area where Comcast internet service is available.
- Not have subscribed to Comcast internet within the last 90 days.
- Not have outstanding debt to Comcast that is less than one year old.
- Have at least one child eligible for the National School Lunch Program OR receive HUD housing assistance such as public housing, housing choice vouchers, or multifamily assistance.
- A form of ID is required.

(Special pilot eligibility programs are available for senior citizens and community college students, in limited locations.)
